Do you know of technical guidance for humanitarian responses in increasingly climate stressed situations?

We have received a request from actors in the global humanitarian community for technical insight and expertise on guidance for humanitarian responses in increasingly climate stressed situations, in particular where sites are located in places at increasing risk of flooding and / or heat waves. It appears that written guidance either does not yet exist or it is not readily available.

The insights will be used to either ensure that existing written guidance is more readily available to the global humanitarian community, or if no existing guidance exists there may be an opportunity to work together with the partner organisations that have approached us to secure funding and develop this guidance together.

- Planning for flood in at-risk sites comprising temporary / transitional shelters and facilities (e.g. hospitals, health clinics, schools), to ensure that safe shelter, clean water, adequate sanitation, access to food and other essential items, provision of healthcare etc can be continued during and after such events.
- Planning for heat waves in at-risk sites comprising temporary / transitional shelters and facilities (e.g. hospitals, health clinics, schools), as above to ensure that critical needs are still met. In particular, there is concern for maternal and child health clinics as infants are unable to regulate their own temperatures and excessive heat in the clinics will cause fatalities that may be preventable with better heat management.

10 years of history

We celebrated our 10th anniversary as a community and wrote our history in a book. Since 2012 our goal is to respond to social injustice and inequality. For this reason, we accompany community organizations and neighborhoods in the Buenos Aires suburbs, Chubut, Santa Fe, Ushuaia and the outskirts of Córdoba. Similarly, we approached Santiago del Estero, especially its isolated rural communities, to think collectively about how to solve the problem of access to water, a human right that is still not guaranteed. At the same time, we created the Education and Impact area to exchange and build knowledge with other organizations and professionals. The road we have traveled has left us with the firm conviction that anything is possible when the collective is put into action and technology is at the service of the common good.

In order to increase educational opportunities in rural areas, this year we also built a **university residence** in Casilda, Santa Fe province, together with Fundación SI. This project makes it possible for **18 young people** from different rural communities in the country to have a place to live while they study veterinary sciences.

Engineering Without Borders Argentina

Access to water in rural communities



This year we consolidated our program for access to water and sanitation in isolated rural areas in the south of Santiago del Estero, **seeking to influence public policies and accompanying the communities.** These are places where **more than 65%** of the families do not have any water storage infrastructure and **88%** of them move, even on a daily basis, in search of this resource. At the beginning of 2022, we presented [the report of the survey](#) on the situation of access to water and we will continue to generate data to make this reality visible. In the area of San Antonio de Copo, we completed a project for the construction of rainwater harvesting and storage systems with **23 families** and we started working in the area of San Antonio Oeste. We also trained and advised the municipalities of the Department of Avellaneda and the EFA Avellaneda Farming School in the formulation of water projects. Another achievement to contribute to the solution of an urgent problem in the North of the country was to collaborate with the "Program for access to water, sanitation and hygiene in scattered rural areas" of the National Ministry of Public Works. We continue working for the right to water!

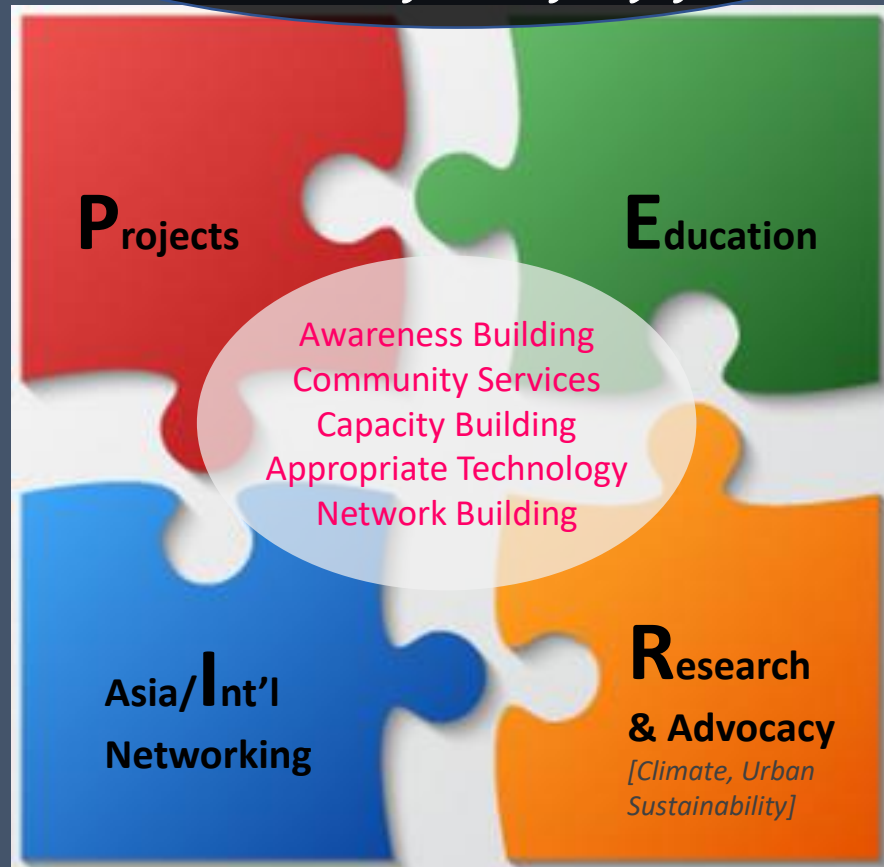

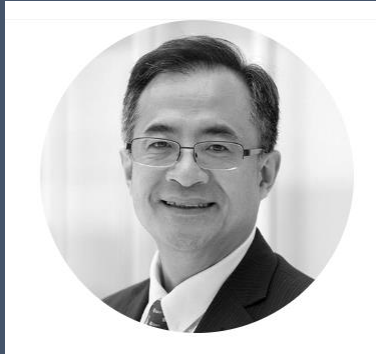

Currently acting as the Chairman, he has been serving the Advisory Committee of the School of Energy and Environment of CityU since its inception in 2009.

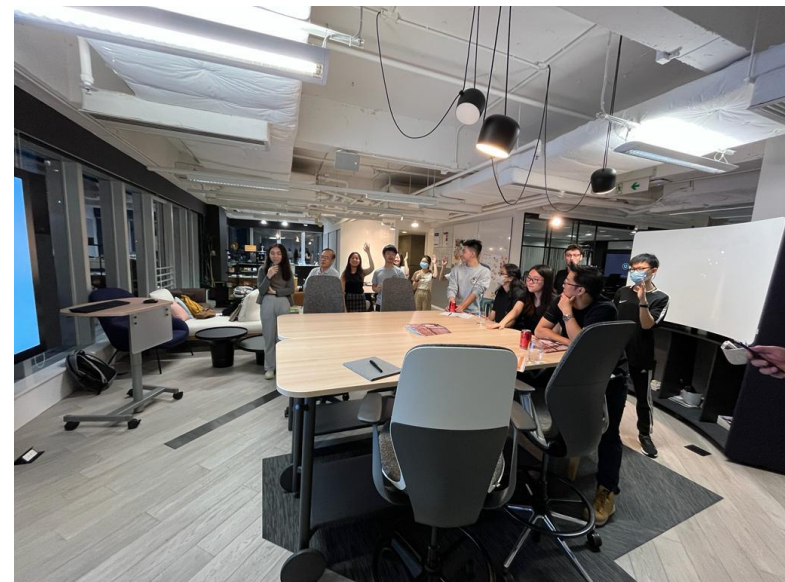
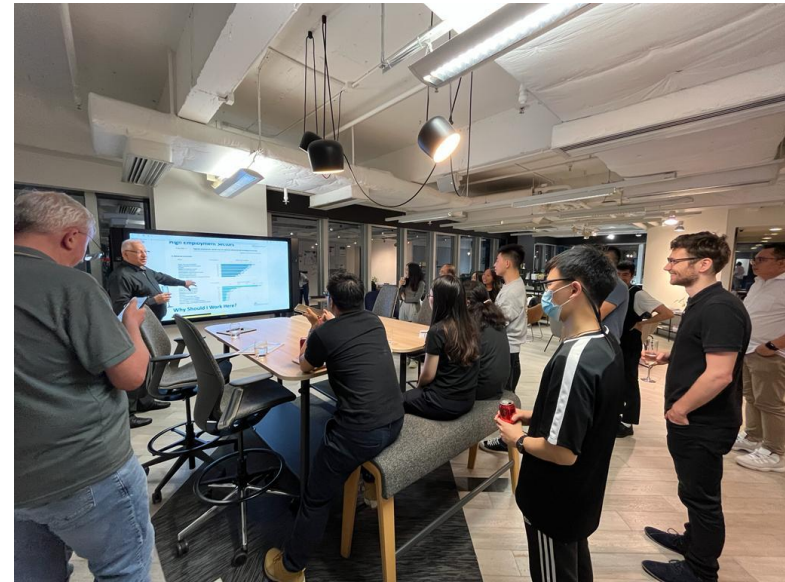

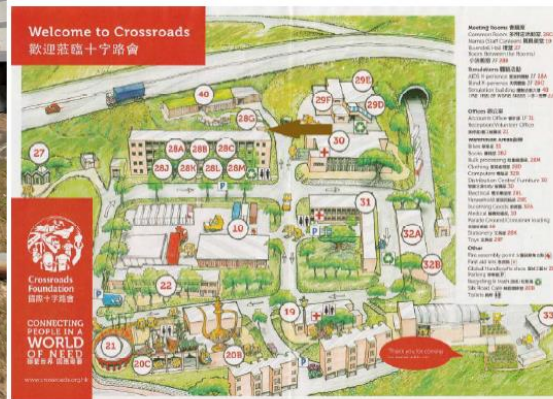

However, we also welcome projects in some scale that will substantially improve the living of our target beneficiaries. Such projects, when they come by, may need capital costs.
